This year, the Economic Development Department has worked diligently to create a progressive and distinctive brand for the Northern Lights District. The blending of colors represents the many industries that operate in the district such as hospitality, education, corporate offices, and retail. The border and the bleed of colors symbolizes our ability to think outside the box. The font is clean and contemporary to resemble the new modern architecture in the district. We have since used the logo on high end collateral pieces such as heavy-weight business cards, professionally developed website and aerial video design, and modern glassware.



SIGNAGE IMPROVEMENTS

In 2017, the City worked with current businesses in the Northern Lights Overlay District to implement a user friendly design. This will compliment corridor improvements and encourage future investments in the district.

In 2017, we have seen new companies such as GIRD Systems, and Strategic Data Systems (SDS) move operations to the Northern Lights District. We are proud to have 55 new high-paying jobs to the district.

RECENT INVESTMENTS

In 2017, we have seen new companies such as GIRD Systems, and Strategic Data Systems (SDS) move operations to the Northern Lights District. We are proud to have 55 new high-paying jobs to the district.

TRU by Hilton: One of the newest brands of Hilton Worldwide, recently announced plans to break ground in Sharonville's Northern Lights District. The modern, select service hotel will be located at 11167 Dowlin Drive, along I-75 just off of Sharon Road. This new project will bring 29 new hospitality jobs to the district.

Pro on Call: The well-established IT and telecommunications company recently announced their intent to relocate their corporate headquarters to Kemper Road in Sharonville. Over the next 3 years, Pro on Call Technologies will bring 38 new jobs to our city.

Worly Plumbing Supply: A plumbing supply store will be expanding their operations into Sharonville, located at 12071 Best Place, near the corner of Mosteller and E.Crescentville Road. This Ohio-based store first expanded into the Cincinnati market in 1992, and is now choosing Sharonville for their second regional location. This project will generate 22 jobs in their first year, adding an additional 5 in the years following.

Strategic Data Systems: The A Dayton area technology company is expanding with it's first Cincinnati office in Sharonville's Northern Lights District. SDS expects their future space in the Spectrum Office Tower to be finished and ready to move-in by mid-August.

Baker Hughes: A GE industrial service company has plans to move their Inspection Technology Customer Solution center to Tramway Drive near Hawk Road in Sharonville. The hub will be opening in late 2017 with 15 employees, and growing to a company of 40 in the upcoming years. In addition to the 40 new jobs, Baker Hughes plans to invest \$4 million into the city for the facility.

GIRD Systems: The Research and Development firm will be moving their operations from the City of Cincinnati to Sharonville. GIRD will be bring 18 jobs to the Spectrum Office Tower in the Northern Lights District, and will be adding additional jobs in the coming years. GIRD works closely with major research branches within the DOD, other government agencies to provide the latest, most up to date services in digital signal processing.

The Sharonville Economic Development Department is currently working hard to bring new restaurants, and to expand entertainment options in the Northern Lights District. In 2018, the Sharonville Entertainment District will be expanded and now encompass the whole Northern Lights District boundaries.

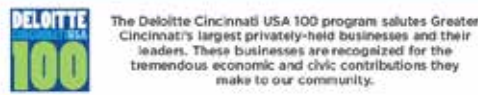

BUSINESS ASSISTANCE

The City of Sharonville strives to be a resource for small business owners, assisting them with their unique needs. One resource is providing site selection assistance, to help business owners find their right location in Sharonville. The City of Sharonville partners with the Chamber of commerce to help businesses prosper through their benefits, programs, and networking opportunities. The Sharonville Small Business Alliance (SSBA) meets monthly, and features guest speakers such as other City departments. Past speakers include the Sharonville Tax, Fire, and Police Departments.
