NORTHERN LIGHTS DISTRICT A DISTRICT IN MOTION



The Northern Lights District is a 365 acre redevelopment area along I-75. It is home to the Sharonville Convention Center, Viking Village Sports and Performance Complex and many businesses. The district is the premier destination for corporate, performance and sports visitors.

DELTA HOTEL BY MARRIOTT CINCINNATI

Delta Hotels by Marriott Cincinnati Sharonville flag was secured by the current owners of Ramada Plaza. The 226 room/13-story hotel has begun extensive renovations and will reopen as the first Delta Marriott in Ohio. This location of Marriott's newest upscale, full-service brand will offer 14,000 sq. ft. of meeting space, a full-service restaurant, rooftop bar, business center, a well-appointed fitness center, seasonal outdoor gathering space and year-round swimming pool. The total investment is expected to be between \$8 million-\$10 million.

TRU BY HILTON

Tru By Hilton Sharonville hosted a groundbreaking ceremony with state, county and local elected officials on their 98 room hotel at 11163 Dowlin Drive. The \$14 million dollar hotel is a new construction concept under the Hilton flag and is the first to be constructed in the region.

QuEST GLOBAL

QuEST Global is an engineering services and solutions partner to many of the world's most recognized Fortune 500 brands. They announced an expansion project that will create 60 new jobs and invest \$200,000 in capital investments. QuEST currently has 60 employees at their location at 11499 Chester Road.

THIRD EYE BREWING

Third Eye Brewing Company a \$1.7M Microbrewery/ Restaurant will be coming in 2019. The new microbrewery will be a modern, 6,000 square feet building with large retractable windows, garage doors, glass, steel and reclaimed wood.

NORTHERN LIGHTS DISTRICT EXPANDS

The Northern Lights Entertainment District expanded to match the lines of the whole TIFF District. There are now 15 D-5J liquor licenses available anywhere in the district.



LAQUINTA INN

LaQuinta Inn and Suites completed an \$8M full renovation in 2018. Updates to the 151 contemporary rooms included new meeting spaces, lobby, and upgraded façade. They also incorporated a new hot breakfast.

SONESTA ED SUITES

Sonesta ED Suites Cincinnati Sharonville West recently completed \$6.5 million in hotel/suite renovations. The hotel offers studio and two bedroom loft suites for corporate and leisure travelers.



MISS OHIO USA/MISS OHIO TEEN USA

MISS Ohio USA/Miss Ohio Teen USA Organization selected the Northern Lights District to host the 2019 MISS OHIO USA State Event. The Cincinnati USA North Convention & Visit Bureau, the City of Sharonville, Viking Village's Mathews Auditorium, the Sharonville Convention Center and the Sharonville Ramada Plaza all worked together to submit a bid to bring the event to Sharonville.

SHARONVILLE CONVENTION CENTER EXPANSION

Sharonville Convention Center was awarded a grant from Hamilton County to begin the design and schematics of our exhibit hall expansion project. The proposed expansion project will double the exhibition hall space from 20,000 to 40,000 square feet.

THE LIVINN HOTEL

The LivInn located directly adjacent to the Sharonville Convention Center, has added a salt water pool and installed a new LED sign, elevator and landscaping. In addition, a new walkway connects guests directly to the Sharonville Convention Center. The total investment for this project is \$1.7 million.

FOUNTAINS TRANSITIONAL CARE

Fountains Transitional Care is a \$7.7 million state-of-the-art post-acute skilled nursing and rehabilitation community located at 1400 Mallard Cove Drive. The new transitional care community features 54 luxury, well-appointed post-acute/ short term rehab suites with spacious living space and private bathrooms, 118 new jobs were created.
